


RENEW International 2013 Gala Honorees



Short Speech by Father Joe Healey, MM at the RENEW Gala

Thank you, Sister Terry, for your kind introduction. I am delighted to receive this Msgr. Thomas Kleissler Award on behalf of the 120,000 Small Christian Communities (SCCs) in the nine countries of Eastern Africa. The members of my own St. Kizito SCC in Nairobi, Kenya greet all of you. The Women's Sewing Group made the shirt that I am wearing for the first time tonight. The children in my SCC greet your own children and grandchildren. Please bring home to them some Ghanaian chocolate on the table in the Africa Room (and don't forget to take some for yourself!). I would like to welcome the two African Maryknoll Sisters to come up here to the microphone, please. Sister Theresia Ndesoma, MM is from Moshi Diocese in Tanzania. Sister Ann Mutinda, MM is from Machakos Diocese in Kenya. When I asked them what we should do tonight they said, "Sing a SCC song, of course." It is a clapping song so you join in too. It is called "Iende Mbele Injili"in Swahili that means "Let the Word of God Go Forth" and is used during our Bible Processions.
